

State law requires that this one-quarter of one percent sales and use tax be reauthorized by special election every four years. The Special Election will be held in conjunction with the General Election and is open to all eligible voters of the City of Selma.


Movie-in-the-Park

ALTON BOULEVARD RECONSTRUCTION



The City of Selma recently completed the long awaited street reconstruction project on Alton Boulevard. This project joins a list other recent street reconstruction projects in the Selma Park Estates area. The project spans the entire length of Alton Boulevard from Arcadia Boulevard to the Selma-Live Oak city limit. Alton Boulevard was expanded to a consistent width of twenty-four feet. Drainage ditches on each side of the roadway were eliminated in order to accommodate the larger width. The City utilized an “inverted crown” design to contain storm water. In this design, the center of the street is lower than the edges, thus utilizing the natural design slope of the street to direct the flow of possible drainage. In some places, drainage will be captured and directed by curbs.

The City is currently beginning preparations for a similar reconstruction project on Woodcliffe Boulevard, which is also located in the Selma Park Estates subdivision. The Woodcliffe Boulevard reconstruction program will mirror the recently completed Alton Boulevard project. In coming weeks, the City Council will determine a timeline and guideline for City Staff to begin the contract bidding process. More information will be provided as it becomes available.

With projects such as the Alton Boulevard and the Woodcliffe Boulevard reconstruction projects, as well as future construction projects, the City continues to strive to enhance the quality of life for its residents and businesses.

- Passed Ordinance Number 011416-04, adding Article III of Chapter 46 to the Code of Ordinances to prohibit possession of a concealed handgun or of an open carry handgun in the City Council Chambers and at other places at Selma City Hall when the City Council Chambers or other places are being used for a meeting subject to the Texas Open Meets Act, as the Municipal Courtroom for the City, or as a Polling Place for Elections, and in any office of the Municipal Court and setting out the penalty for violation
- Approved the Interlocal Water Supply Contract by and among the Schertz/Seguin Local Government Corporation, the City of Selma, the City of Schertz, and the City of Seguin for an additional two-hundred fifty (250) acre-feet of water rights

Selma’s Cross Connection Control Program

Every drinking water system in Texas must have a cross connection control program, more commonly known as a backflow prevention program. Backflow prevention is designed to protect the public water supply from contamination from customer’s plumbing systems. More information regarding backflow testing can be found at <http://www.tceq.state.tx.us/assets/public/assistance/sblga/c4simodel.pdf> or <https://www.bsionlinetracking.com/customer/faq>.

Backflow prevention devices are required on all residential properties with irrigation or fire protection systems. Commercial and industrial businesses also are required to have backflow prevention devices.

The City of Selma has contracted with Backflow Solutions Inc. (BSI) to manage our backflow inspection program. BSI has experience managing similar programs for other municipalities across the country. BSI will serve as the primary point of contact for backflow inspections within the City of Selma and can be contacted at 800-414-4990.

It is a requirement that every backflow device be inspected annually by a certified backflow tester. The results of the inspection must be submitted to BSI Online. Backflow prevention inspectors shall submit inspection results to BSI as part of their service.

Customers with known devices will receive a notification and reminder directly from BSI Online that testing is due. Once the annual inspection is complete, the testing company will enter that information directly into BSI’s online reporting system.

Annual Spring Cleanup

This year's Annual Spring Clean Up will be from April 9th through April 17th. Hazardous waste will be accepted at the City Hall location only, on the weekends of April 9th & 10th and again on April 16th & 17th.

The Spring Clean Up is restricted to Selma residents only. Waste delivered must be separated by type of material by the resident. Spring Clean Up activities do not apply to commercial businesses. A current water bill or tax statement and proper identification are required when making a drop off.



Household Waste to be accepted:

- General household waste, furniture and bedding, washers, dryers, stoves and any other non-hazardous material can be dropped off, free of charge, during clean up, Monday through Sunday, 8am to 5pm.
- Material will be sorted by the customer, not by Bexar Waste employees.
- Appliances containing Freon will be accepted for free only if the Freon tank is removed. If the Freon tank is still attached, a \$35.00 fee will be assessed at the time of drop off. For questions concerning Freon tank removal, please contact Bexar Waste

Hazardous Items Accepted (only at Selma City Hall):

- Insecticides, pesticides, herbicides, fertilizers, chemicals, cleaning or bleach products, and swimming pool cleaners.
- Enamel and latex paints in cans and aerosol dispensers, varnish and stains, paint thinners and removers, acetone, etc.
- E-Recycling: Computers, TV's, VCR's, microwaves and other household electronics.
- Empty propane tanks, up to 7 gallons (VALVE MUST BE ENTIRELY REMOVED)
- All common metals will be accepted.

*** Tires on rims or wheels, commercial vehicle tires, tractor tires, and heavy equipment tires will not be accepted

As a reminder, chipper service is provided for the residents of the City of Selma only. This service IS NOT for professional landscaping services to call for the City to come chip the contractor-produced waste.

When professional landscape contracts are entered into by the residents, have the removal of the contractor-generated waste included in the contract.

Here are brief reminders & guidelines to remember when preparing for chipper service:

- No palm limbs can be chipped—they will clog the chipper;
- No tree limbs wider than 12 inches in diameter;

- No tree stumps, plywood, wood, or fencing can be chipped;
- All brush and tree limbs must be stacked at the front curb to allow easy access for City staff (City staff is not allowed to enter onto private property);
- No bulk items or trash will be chipped (arrangements can be made with **Bexar Waste at 210-566-5454** to remove these bulk items);
- Please remember to set piles for chipper service as close to the first week of the month as feasible; putting piles for chipper service too early can result in nesting for snakes and other animals.
