ANNUAL FALL CLEANUP

This year's Annual Fall Clean Up will be from October 29th through November 6th. Hazardous waste will be accepted at the City Hall location only, on the weekends of October 29th & 30th and again on November 5th & 6th.

The Fall Clean Up is restricted to Selma residents only. Waste delivered must be separated by type of material by the resident. Fall Clean Up activities do not apply to commercial businesses. A current water bill or tax statement and proper identification are required when making a drop off.

Household Waste to be accepted:

- General household waste, furniture and bedding, washers, dryers, stoves and any other non-hazardous material can be dropped off, free of charge, during clean up, Monday through Sunday, 8am to 5pm.
- Material will be sorted by the customer, not by Bexar Waste employees.
- Appliances containing Freon will be accepted for free only if the Freon tank is removed. If the Freon tank is still attached, a \$35.00 fee will be assessed at the time of drop off. For questions concerning Freon tank removal, please contact Bexar Waste

Hazardous Items Accepted (only at Selma City Hall):

- Insecticides, pesticides, herbicides, fertilizers, chemicals, cleaning or bleach products, and swimming pool cleaners.
- Enamel and latex paints in cans and aerosol dispensers, varnish and stains, paint thinners and removers, acetone, etc.
- E-Recycling: Computers, TV's, VCR's, microwaves and other household electronics.
- Empty propane tanks, up to 7 gallons (VALVE MUST BE ENTIRELY REMOVED)
- All common metals will be accepted.

*** Tires on rims or wheels, commercial vehicle tires, tractor tires, and heavy equipment tires will not be accepted



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HARRISON HOUSE GRAND OPENING

On August 10, 2016 the City of Selma celebrated the long awaited grand opening of the John S. Harrison City Park & Historic Site. A large gathering of elected officials and local residents joined in the celebration to welcome the City of Selma's newest and most historical attraction.

The site has been under development as a city park and historic farm complex over the past five years. The 13-acre property and surrounding land was first settled by John Harrison and his wife Martha in 1852. John Harrison, along with his brother-in-law William McCulloch established the Harrison & McCulloch Stage Line in 1850 and maintained a stage stop as a part of the operation, which is located at IH-35 and Evans Road. After the Harrisons left Selma only a few years later, three other families, including the Friesenhahn, occupied the property from 1905 until 2000. The John S. Harrison House allows residents and visitors to Selma to take a step back in time and visualize what life was like for our earliest settlers.

The Harrison property is listed as a State Archaeological Landmark and the house is listed on the National Registry of Historic Places. The opening of the farm complex represents the completion of the second in a four phase development process. The park phase opened in April of

2015 upon the completion of a large pavilion and playground area. A hike/bike trail connecting the Harrison Park with the existing Stage Stop Park and development of the remaining four acres will follow in coming years.

House and Ownership
The core of the original house was one room constructed of locally quarried limestone blocks and built by John S. Harrison and his wife Martha Jane, in 1852. The small room on the north side of the original structure is believed to have been added in the mid to late 1800's. John Harrison moved to Texas in 1833 from Roane County, Tennessee. He and Martha moved to the Selma area in 1852. As in all small homes of that day, the two limestone block rooms served a variety of uses including storage, living area, bedroom, and nursery. The Friesenhahn family purchased the property in 1905. Hired by the Friesenhahns, Harry Albrecht, a highly skilled local carpenter, built the wood framed additions that today surround the original stone core of the house. An ornate porch wrapped around the south and east sides of the house and a separate, outdoor kitchen stood near the west side. The porch on the east side was eventually removed by the Friesenhahns. At one time, the attic was used as a sleeping loft and was reached by way of a staircase attached to the exterior of the building. The home continued to see additions and renovations between 1905 and 1960. The Schmid and Geyer families bought the property from the Harrisons in 1854. The Schmid family cemetery was established at the back of the original 127 acres, near the Kincaid Cemetery, where both Schmid and Geyer family members are buried. The Stautzenbergers purchased the house in 1894 but only stayed on the property for 11 years. The Friesenhahn family occupied the house for 96 years until it was purchased by the City of Selma in 2001.

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Selma’s Cross Connection Control Program

Every drinking water system in Texas must have a cross connection control program, more commonly known as a backflow prevention program. Backflow prevention is designed to protect the public water supply from contamination from customer’s plumbing systems. More information regarding backflow testing can be found at <http://www.tceq.state.tx.us/assets/public/assistance/sblga/c4simodel.pdf> or <https://www.bsonlinetracking.com/customer/faq>.

Backflow prevention devices are required on all residential properties with irrigation or fire protection systems. Commercial and industrial businesses also are required to have backflow prevention devices.

The City of Selma has contracted with Backflow Solutions Inc. (BSI) to manage our backflow inspection program. BSI has experience managing similar programs for other municipalities across the country. BSI will serve as the primary point of contact for backflow inspections within the City of Selma and can be contacted at 800-414-4990.

It is a requirement that every backflow device be inspected after installation by a certified backflow tester. The results of the inspection must be submitted to BSI Online. Backflow prevention inspectors shall submit inspection results to BSI as part of their service.

Once the inspection is complete, the testing company will enter that information directly into BSI’s online reporting system.

Best management practices for conserving water include prohibiting watering lawns and other landscaping between the hours of 10AM and 8PM unless such watering is by hand-held bucket, hand-held hose, or a properly installed drip-irrigation system. Water runoff from property is prohibited.

Be the Solution to Storm Water Pollution! Washing your car at home washes soaps and detergents into the storm water drainage system. Consider taking your car to a commercial car wash that treats its wastewater.

Chipper Service

Chipper Service is provided to residents free of charge during the **FIRST WEEK** of every month. If you would like to add your address to the monthly chipper service list, please call **210-651-7800**.

As a reminder, chipper service is provided for the residents of the City of Selma only. This service IS NOT for professional landscaping services to call for the City to come chip the contractor-produced waste.

When professional landscape contracts are entered into by the residents, have the removal of the contractor-generated waste included in the contract.

Here are brief reminders & guidelines to remember when preparing for chipper service:

- No palm limbs will be chipped as they will clog the chipper;
- No tree limbs wider than 12 inches in diameter;

- No tree stumps, plywood, wood, or fencing can be chipped;
- All brush and tree limbs must be stacked at the front curb to allow easy access for City staff (City staff is not allowed to enter onto private property);
- No bulk items or trash will be chipped (arrangements can be made with **Bexar Waste at 210-566-5454** to remove these bulk items);
- Please remember to set piles for chipper service as close to the first week of the month as feasible; putting piles for chipper service too early can result in nesting for snakes and other animals.
